Winter

Cross-country skiing is available from our front door. There is a wonderful network of disused town roads, logging roads and horse trails that leads through the countryside from the house or, alternatively, we are a short drive from Windblown cross-country ski area. We have a selection of cross-country equipment in the barn that is available for use.

Downhill skiing can be found to the north at Pat's Peak (45 minutes drive) or Mount Sunapee (just over 1 hour).



Spring

Admittedly not New Hampshire's finest hour (known locally as "mud season" or "blackfly season"), we can still offer great hiking trails right out of the door and Mount Monadnock begins to beckon having shrugged off its snowy winter shawl. Once the flowers start to bloom in late April and May, we begin to revel in the outdoors again after our long winter.

Summer

Halfway between Thorndike Pond and Dublin Lake, we are wonderfully situated for enjoying the local beaches. We have a canoe and a small sail boat (a sunfish) that are available for use.

Summer theatre at the Peterborough Players is nearby and the summer lyceum lecture series at the Unitarian church in Peterborough is famous throughout New England.



Fall

Our crowning glory. No biting insects and the spectacular display of New England's autumn foliage. There is nothing quite like a hike up Monadnock through golden avenues with the crisp leaves crunching underfoot and then your efforts rewarded with a breathtaking view at the summit.

You can enjoy cross-country skiing or hiking on old carriage roads from our front door, swimming in lovely Thorndike Pond, less than a mile down the road, or climbing good old Monadnock herself with a choice of trails all within 3 miles from our location.

Your room is an addition to this historic building, with cathedral ceilings, attached deck, picture windows with a winter view of the mountain, and a private bathroom. Your stay can be as private as you'd like, as there is a separate entrance to your room, but we welcome you to sit by the woodstove with a cup of tea or coffee in our living area.

Breakfast can be served in your room or in the dining room at your convenience. We ask that you inform us the night before what time you'd like to eat. We serve a full English breakfast complete with unlimited coffee or tea. Special requests within limits are allowed, but we appreciate advance notice. An evening dinner option is also available upon request - we both love to cook.

We will gladly inform you of all the local happenings within the region. A wealth of restaurants, shops, antiques, music, art, and theatre awaits you in addition to the natural resources and outdoor recreation. And we will happily give you directions to our favorite pub, Harlows, in the nearby town of Peterborough, which has live music and great food.

We'd love to share some of the beauty that surrounds us with you.
