## A Winter Ski-Away to Courmayeur

**F**antastically situated on the sunny Italian side of Mont Blanc, the legendary ski resort of Courmayeur merges spectacular mountain scenery with stylish village charm. Offering something for everyone—from 13,000-foot mountain peaks and imposing castles, to cobbled streets and fine dining—it is the most captivating of the Aosta Valley resorts bordering France and Switzerland.

Courmayeur offers skiing for all, including famous runs such as the resort’s World Cup Downhill and the International, a 4-mile run that drops 3,300 feet as it descends. The diverse number of runs and lifts provides plenty of skiing all morning and afternoon, with amazing views of Mont Blanc, Western Europe’s highest mountain.

There’s an abundance of easy cruising for those just starting out, as well as high mountains and bumpy black for better skiers. Heli-skiing is also popular, with skiers and snowboarders hopping over the border from France. Cross-country skiers will find small but beautiful trails in Val Ferret just outside town in the direction of the Mont Blanc Tunnel, with additional possibilities in Dolonne. And the mountain restaurants are among the best you’ll ever sample!

The village of Courmayeur, lined with quaint buildings on cobbled streets, offers up an assortment of superb restaurants that will appeal to all tastes and budgets. On weekends the resort takes on a distinctly Italian persona when the narrow streets of the grand old village are alive with fur coats, fashion, and greetings of “Ciao bella.” From slope-side excitement to cozy apres ski celebrations to superlative shopping, an escape to Courmayeur captures the essence and excitement of winter’s drama.

**Overnight: Flight**

Transfer from Barrington via private motor coach to Logan International Airport for departure to Milan, Italy.

**Saturday, February 25**

**Overnight: Courmayeur**

Upon arrival in Milan, a private motor coach transfers you to your hotel in Courmayeur. Here you will have time to unpack and begin to explore the village, before gathering for a relaxing dinner in the evening. **(D)**



But first things first: There are two main ski areas at Courmayeur. The largest of these two locations, Checrouit-Val Veny, is situated directly above the resort, and is largely suited to beginners and intermediates, although there are some challenging off-piste descents from top to bottom that may be undertaken with the assistance of a guide.

The most famous run at Courmayeur is the 13-mile descent of the Vallée

Blanche down to Chamonix from Helbronner Point (11,053 feet), reached

in half an hour from the La Palud cable car station. The descent takes 4 to 5 hours allowing for breaks for food, drink, and photographs. Once in Chamonix, participants traditionally enjoy a “gigantic beer” before returning to Courmayeur by bus through the Mont Blanc Tunnel.

For more experienced skiers there is a 6,561-foot vertical descent down to La Palud that begins at Helbronner Point and continues over the Toula Glacier. Other popular runs are the Col d’Arp, l’Arp Veille, and Couloir of Dolonne.

to superlative shopping. And there’s never a lack of dining possibilities, with a brilliant range of restaurants that spans The Tunnel (quick but fantastic pizza) to Pierre Alexis (romantically upscale) and everything in between. **(B)**
