Amsterdam Backstage

March 16th - 25th 2018

Dear Vassar Travelers,

As Vassar faculty members and friends who greatly enjoy each other's areas of expertise, we are delighted to invite you to join us for an arts adventure, centering on Amsterdam, one of the most historically, culturally and aesthetically interesting cities in the world, as vividly recounted in our suggested reading for the trip: Russell Shorto's *Amsterdam: A History of the World's Most Liberal City* of 2013.

Our goal will be to experience and discuss a range of major artistic creations, in art, music and dance. Throughout the trip our explorations will take us to a selection of magnificent Dutch museums in Amsterdam itself, also ranging beyond the city to the Frans Hals Museum in nearby



Haarlem, The Mauritshuis in The Hague, the Dutch royal palace Het Loo at Appeldoorn, and the Kröller-Müller Museum within the lovely national nature reserve of the "High Velvet" at Otterloo. Short informal lectures before various visits will prepare everyone for major works on view in each museum, and for appreciating the architecture and history of the museum itself. During each visit, generous time will also be available for everyone to freely wander through the galleries in order to make their own discoveries or discuss what they are seeing.

In dance, we will focus on Holland as a hub of important contemporary dance: the culmination of our dance events will be a performance by the Dutch National Ballet entitled *Dutch Doubles*, an evening of three one-act ballets, all world premieres and all choreographed by Dutch choreographers. The choreographers are Ernst Meisner, Annabelle Ochoa Lopez (who was recently part of a residency at Vassar College) and distinguished Dutch choreographer Hans Van Manen, who at 85 years of age is still creating vibrant new work. We will meet the Artistic Director of Het National Ballet, Ted Brandsen, to discuss the importance of new creations in this art form, known best for its 19th-century works. On our trip to The Hague we will spend time with Ros Anderson Dunn who will talk to us about her fascinating career dancing in Nederlands Dance Theater and staging the works of the renowned choreographer Jiri Kylian. We will travel to Lelystadt to see a performance of Het National's junior company and to Rotterdam for a performance of the venerable Dutch contemporary dance company Scapino, the oldest dance company in the Nederlands.

Some of us may be more familiar with Amsterdam and its surroundings than others, but the dual focus of our trip should provide opportunities for many lively and illuminating conversations about matters of great interest to us all. We hope that you will join us as we explore and share what promises to be a unique, edifying and, above all, extremely enjoyable experience.



SATURDAY, MARCH 17[™] - Morning arrival in Amsterdam. Your flight will be met to transfer to our city-center hotel. We have arranged for your rooms to be ready immediately upon arrival and, after checking in, there will be time to unpack, relax and find some lunch

at a local restaurant. This afternoon a local guide will introduce the highlights of the city – from a canal boat! Amsterdam was built around a network of canals that crisscross the city and they provide the best way to see most of the major sites. This evening we will gather for a welcome reception and introductory lecture, followed by dinner at the hotel. **(D) OVERNIGHT: AMSTERDAM**



SUNDAY, MARCH 18TH - After a leisurely free morning in the city, we will be travelling to the nearby town of Lelystad for an afternoon performance by the Het National Ballet's Junior Company. We'll travel with them on their bus and have free time for lunch in Lelystad while they prepare for the 3.30 pm performance. We'll return to Amster-

dam with the dancers on their bus after the show. This evening we will have dinner at a local restaurant with Ted Brandsen, the Artistic Director of the Het National Ballet. **(B, D) OVERNIGHT: AMSTERDAM**

MONDAY, MARCH 19TH - Our excursion today takes us to the seat of government of the Netherlands (not to be confused with the capital city, Amsterdam), the ancient port city of Den Haag (The Hague). We'll take a short tour of the city center and then visit the Mesdag Panorama. This amazing canvas (nearly 400 feet long and 46 feet high) was commissioned from the artist Hendrik Willem Mesdag in 1880 and shows the seaside town of Scheveningen as it was in 1881. Then we'll break for lunch, where we will be joined by Ros Anderson Dunn, who will talk to us about her career in Nederlands Dance Theater and her subsequent work traveling the world staging the works of the brilliant choreographer and former director of NDT, Jiri Kylian. After lunch we'll take a tour of the Mauritshuis, the Royal Picture Gallery named after Prince John Maurice of Nassau, whose 17th-century residence now houses the collection. We return to Amsterdam for a free evening. (B, L) OVERNIGHT: AMSTERDAM

TUESDAY, MARCH 20TH - Today's excursion takes us to the east of Amsterdam towards the city of Apeldoorn. Our first stop will be to visit the Het Loo Palace, home of the Dutch royal family and now a national museum. To the south of the palace lies the De Hoge Veluwe National Park, 14,000 acres of nature reserve and home to the Kröller-Müller National Museum, housing an important collection of sculpture and art, specializing in the works of Van Gogh. We'll have free time for lunch and then enjoy a guided tour of the museum. There may also be time for individual explorations in the sculpture garden before we return to Amsterdam for a traditional *rijsttafel* dinner. **(B, D) OVERNIGHT: AMSTERDAM** WEDNESDAY, MARCH 21^{sr} - A day in the city today. We'll begin with another private lecture in our series and then travel across town to the Opera House, where we will be able to sit in on a ballet class. We'll take a break for lunch and then come back to attend a rehearsal with the full orchestra. The evening is free. (B) OVERNIGHT: AMSTERDAM

THURSDAY, MARCH 22ND- After a leisurely breakfast, Prof. Kuretsky will give a lecture on some of the highlights you are about to see at the Rijksmuseum. We'll then wander over to the newly-refurbished museum for a short guided tour (approx. one hour) of the museum's highlights. The afternoon will be free to visit some of the other museums in the city (perhaps the nearby Van Gogh Museum). This evening we'll gather for dinner and then attend a performance of Bach's *St Matthew Passion* at the Royal Concertgebouw, Amsterdam's internationally acclaimed concert hall. **(B, D) OVERNIGHT: AMSTERDAM**

FRIDAY, MARCH 23RD - Today there is a full day excursion to the west of the city, with a lecture by Prof. Kuretsky at the hotel before we depart. Our first stop will be the city of Haarlem for a tour of the Frans Hals Museum. After lunch and free time to pursue individual interests, we head south out of the city. The gardens of Keukenhof are located in the heart of the spectacular bulbfields of Holland, which will be approaching full bloom at this time of year. From Keukenhof we continue south to the port city of Rotterdam. There will be free time (Susan Kuretsky will take those interested for a brief tour of the Museum Boijmans Van Beuningen) to explore and to have dinner, before we attend a performance of *Scala* by the Scapino Ballet Company. We return to Amsterdam late this evening after the performance. **(B) OVERNIGHT: AMSTERDAM**

SATURDAY, MARCH 24TH- Our final free day in Amsterdam will be crowned by attending the world premier of *Dutch Doubles*, a trilogy of works by Hans van Manen, Ernst Meisner and Annabelle Lopez Ochoa (who was at Vassar for a residency with Daniil Simkin), created in close collaboration with musicians they admire. We'll have dinner at the hotel before the performance and have been invited to attend a reception after the performance. (**B**, **D**) OVERNIGHT: AMSTERDAM

Sunday, March 25th - This morning there may be time for some last-minute souvenir shopping before your transfer back to Am-



sterdam's Schiphol Airport for return flights to the USA. (B) OVERNIGHT: HOME

Key to included meals: B - breakfast, L - lunch, D - dinner

Please note that at this early stage of trip planning, there may well be other meetings with leading figures in the dance world and chances to attend rehearsals and classes that have not yet been finalized.



YOUR HOST, SUSAN DONAHUE KURETSKY, is the Sarah Gibson Blanding Professor of Art and a member of Vassar's class of 1963. She received her Ph.D. from Harvard University and taught at Boston University before coming back to Vassar. A specialist in the art of the Netherlands, she has published a monograph on the Dutch genre painter Jacob Ochtervelt, numerous articles on Rembrandt and seventeenth century print-making, co-authored the catalogue of Dutch paintings at the Detroit Institute of Arts and produced the 2005 traveling exhibition, *Time and Transformation in Seventeenth Century Dutch Art*. That experience led to the development of a course called "The Museum in History, Theory and Practice," while recent articles on science and technology in Dutch art have been inspired by teaching a Vassar seminar called "Art and

Science in the Age of Vermeer." Her current project – a book to be titled *Rembrandt's Animals* – will explore a largely ignored aspect of this artist's work in relation to the artistic and scientific issues of his period.

YOUR HOST, JOHN MEEHAN was a principal dancer with the Australian Ballet, American Ballet Theater and was a frequent guest artist with the New York City Ballet and National Ballet of Canada. He has partnered many of the world's great ballerinas including Dame Margot Fonteyn, Natalia Makarova, Merrill Ashley, Gelsey Kirkland, Cynthia Gregory, Karen Kain, and the Australian ballet stars Marilyn Rowe and Marilyn Jones. John has choreographed ballets for The Australian Ballet, American Ballet Theatre, Washington Ballet, Metropolitan Opera, and Royal Winnipeg Ballet. Meehan also served as the artistic director of Canada's Royal Winnipeg Ballet, The American Ballet Theatre Studio Company and the Hong Kong Ballet. In 2013 Meehan was named to the Frances Daly Fergusson Chair in the Humanities at Vassar College, where he is currently a professor of dance and the Director of Vassar Repertory Dance Theatre.
