
## EXPLORING THE ART & CULTURE OF HOLLAND & BELGIUM

APRIL 10<sup>TH</sup> - 18<sup>TH</sup> 2020

It is said that God created heaven and earth – except Holland. The Dutch people made that! The ingenious use of windmills, dikes and canals has created large flat and fertile areas that, for hundreds of years, have been cultivated with the most colorful flowers.

This spring we explore the gardens, art, cuisine and culture of this tiny nation and that of neighboring northern Belgium – together known collectively as Flanders. We begin and end in Amsterdam, a city built on a network of canals with its tall and narrow brick houses reflected in the glimmering water. We include a guided tour of the world-famous Rijksmuseum, a day at the Royal Palaces to the east of the city and a visit the magnificent Keukenhof Gardens.

Our travels then take us over the border to the city of Bruges. Known as the "Venice of the North" due to the many picturesque canals crisscrossing the city, we will investigate the three main things for which the region is famous: art, beer and chocolate!



Discover Europe has crafted an itinerary that highlights the gardens,

the museums, and the landscape of Holland in full bloom. The pace is never frantic, yet the days are pleasantly full and there are bound to be some unexpected diversions and adventures along the way. Your tour guide will provide background

history, anecdotes and an insight into Dutch life as you travel around. This April, join us on an unforgettable journey through a country that is bursting with the color and joy of springtime.

FRIDAY, APRIL 10<sup>™</sup> - Departure from your chosen gateway city aboard your overnight flight to Amsterdam. Overnight: Plane

SATURDAY, APRIL 11<sup>TH</sup> - Morning arrival in Amsterdam. Your flight will be met for the transfer to our city-center hotel. After checking in, there will time to unpack, relax and find some lunch at a local restaurant. This afternoon a local guide will introduce the highlights of the city – from a canal boat! Amsterdam was built around the network of canals and they provide the best way to see most of the major sites. This evening we will gather for a welcome reception, followed by dinner at the hotel. (D) OVERNIGHT: AMSTERDAM

SUNDAY, APRIL 12<sup>TH</sup> - The morning will begin with a guided tour of the Rijksmuseum. This national museum was originally founded in 1808 by Louis Bonaparte and houses an exceptional collection of 15 - 17C paintings. The rest of the day is free to explore the city: stroll the canals, shop in the Jordaan district, visit the Van Gogh Museum, or Anne Frank's House. Your tour guide will be on hand to help with suggestions and advice. The evening is free to sample some local cuisine - perhaps a rijsttafel dinner, an Indonesian specialty that is a relic of Dutch colonialism in the East Indies. (B) OVERNIGHT: AMSTERDAM

MONDAY, APRIL 13<sup>TH</sup> - Today's excursion takes us to the east of Amsterdam towards the city of Apeldoorn. Our first stop will be to visit the Het Loo Palace gardens (the palace itself is closed for renovations until 2021), home of the Dutch royal family and now a national museum. To the south of the palace lies the De Hoge Veluwe National Park, 14,000 acres of nature reserve and home to the Kroller-Muller National Museum, housing an important collection of sculpture and art, specializing in works by Van Gogh. We'll have free time for lunch and then a guided tour of the museum. There may also be time for individual exploration in the sculpture garden before we continue our journey to the Huis Doorn Museum. The interior is unchanged from the time when the German Emperor, Wilhelm II, lived in the house. We return to Amsterdam for a free evening. (B) OVERNIGHT: AMSTERDAM



Tuesday, April 14<sup>TH</sup> - Leaving Amsterdam, our journey today takes us to the seat of government of the Netherlands (not to be confused with the capital city, Amsterdam), the ancient port city of Den Haag (The Hague). We'll begin our exploration of the city with a tour of the Peace Palace, the home of the International Court of Justice. After a break for lunch we'll take a tour of the Mauritshuis, the Royal Picture Gallery named after Prince John Maurice of Nassau, whose 17th-century residence now houses the collection. There will then be free time to visit the Stedelijk Museum with its collection of Mondrians, for those interested, or to view the Mesdag Panorama. This amazing canvas (nearly 400 feet long and 46 feet high) was commissioned from the artist Hendrik Willem Mesdag in 1880 and shows the seaside town of Scheveningen as it was in 1881. We'll continue on the city of Bruges, where we'll have dinner at our hotel. (B, D) OVERNIGHT: BRUGES

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 15<sup>TII</sup> - Bruges is the capital of West Flanders and is known as the "Venice of the North," owing to the myriad canals that crisscross the city. A morning walking tour of Bruges with a local guide will introduce this wonderfully-preserved, ancient city and include a visit to Bruges Cathedral. We'll end the tour at the Groeninge Museum, with its world-class collection of Flemish Primitive and later Dutch Masters (including works by Jan van Eyck, Gerard David, and Hieronymus Bosch). We have lunch in Bruges at the sophisticated Assiette Blanche restaurant in the city center and then visit Rooses Chocolate World. We'll have a demonstration of chocolate making, a brief history of the industry and then a chance to sample the products. The rest of the afternoon and evening are free to further explore – perhaps pay a visit to the Memling Museum in St. Jan Hospital or the Museum of Chocolate. (B, L) OVERNIGHT: BRUGES

Thursday, April 16<sup>TH</sup> - Our excursion today takes us first to Ypres, where we will visit the "In the Fields of Flanders" Museum dedicated to the many soldiers who laid down their lives here in the First World War. We then continue to the famous Rodenbach Brewery in Roeselare, where we'll enjoy a tour and tasting and lunch. After lunch it's a short drive to neighboring Ghent, with its wonderful medieval city center. A walking tour will introduce the highlights of the city: St. Bavo Cathedral (home of the Ghent Altarpiece), St. Nicolas Church and the Castle of the Counts of Flanders. We return to Bruges for a free evening. (B, L) OVERNIGHT: BRUGES



FRIDAY, APRIL 17<sup>TH</sup> – Our journey back to Amsterdam today takes us via the bulb fields of the coastal plain. Nowhere is the riot of color better displayed than at the glorious Keukenhof Gardens. We'll spend the better part of our day exploring the many themed gardens and pavilions. In addition to the astounding abundance of blossom, works of art by Dutch artists are on display throughout the park. We continue to our hotel near Amsterdam Airport for our final farewell dinner. (B, D) OVERNIGHT: AMSTERDAM

SATURDAY, APRIL 18<sup>TH</sup> - Morning transfers to Amsterdam's Schiphol Airport for returning flights to the U.S. (B)
