



SUNDAY, APRIL 28<sup>st</sup> - The ancient Roman city of Arles was once the capital of Gaul, Britain and Spain and today is home to one of the best preserved Roman arenas in Europe. We'll have a gentle walking orientation of the city this morning, including a visit to the Cathedral, where St. Augustine was consecrated bishop of the English in 597, and the monumental

Roman amphitheater. The afternoon and evening are free to pursue individual interests (R) Overnous are free.

MONDAY, APRIL 29<sup>TH</sup> - A morning excursion to the Pont du Gard, the vast Roman aqueduct built without an ounce of mortar and still standing intact after two thousand years! We continue to Avignon, the papal city during the fourteenth century, for a walking tour of its highlights with a local guide, including a visit to the Palais des Papes. Return to Arles for a free evening and a chance to sample a traditional French meal in a local restaurant. (B)

TUESDAY, APRIL 30<sup>TH</sup> - After a drive through the Vaucluse Region of Provence, we'll have a walking tour of Aix-en-Provence, the elegant and honey-hued former capital with "the most satisfying street in France." The Cours Mirabeau, canopied by soaring plane trees and decked with fountains, is lined with an abundance of cafes and patisseries. Our tour leads us through the mansions of the Mazarin district, past the famous dolphin fountain, to the church of Ste-Marie-Madeleine with its controversial Triptych of the Annunciation, and then the Gothic cathedral of Saint-Sauveur. We'll visit the Atelier Paul Cezanne – the studio kept just as it was when he died in 1906. The narrow lanes in Vieil Aix feature some of Provence's finest architecture and most delightful shopping, and the afternoon is free before we return to Arles for dinner. (B, D) OVERNIGHT: ARLES

WEDNESDAY, MAY 1<sup>st</sup> - A free day to enjoy this magnificent city. (B) OVERNIGHT: ARLES

**THURSDAY, MAY 2**<sup>ND</sup> - Today we begin our explorations at the 11<sup>th</sup>-century fortified hilltop village of Les Baux. We continue to St-Remy-de-Provence, a dreamy and unspoiled town where Van Gogh painted, and we'll explore the old town before we visit the monastery of St. Paul-de-Mausole. This afternoon we visit the fascinating settlement of Glanum just outside St. Remy. Originally a Neolithic homestead, Glanum was later built on by the ancient Greeks and the

Romans. We return to Arles for dinner this evening. (B, D) OVERNIGHT: ARLES



FRIDAY, MAY 3<sup>RD</sup> - Our final excursion today takes us first to the city of Nimes. Our walking tour of the old city will include a visit to the incredibly well-preserved Roman temple known as the Maison Carree. After time for lunch, we'll drive to the coast to the ancient walled town of Aigues-Mortes and then head back through the salt-marsh, nature preserve of the Camargue to Arles. We'll enjoy a farewell dinner together this evening in Arles. (B, D) OVERNIGHT: ARLES
