
Nowhere in the world is the passion for horticulture expressed more vividly than in Britain, where gardens have served as inspiration for painters, writers, and poets for centuries. From great country estates to miniscule inner-city gardens, the British use their exceptionally long growing season to fullest advantage, and we've timed our visit accordingly.

This is your invitation to see some of England's most famous gardens at a time of year when color runs rampant. Among the most notable will be the Royal Horticultural Society's flagship garden at Wisley and Hidcote Manor. We'll tour Barnsley House with the head gardener and then, Royal schedules permitting, we'll take a private tour of Prince Charles' estate at Highgrove.

In London,our tour includes membership in the RHS so that we can attend Chelsea on members-only day, when the crowds are slightly smaller than on the public days, and a visit to Kew to meet with Smith College interns.

MONDAY MAY 20TH - Evening departure from your chosen U.S. gateway city. OVERNIGHT: PLANE


TUESDAY MAY 21^{sr} - Upon arrival at London's Heathrow Airport, you will be met and transported to our hotel in central London. Depending upon your arrival time, you may not be able to check straight in to your hotel room and your tour guide will be there to make suggestions for lunch and local places to visit. After checking in, there will be time to unpack and relax before we gather this evening for a reception and welcome dinner at the hotel, during which Paula Deitz and Tim Johnson will prepare you for your visit to Chelsea tomorrow. **(B, D) OVERNIGHT: LONDON**

WEDNESDAY MAY 22ND- Today we spend a full day at Britain's most famous spring garden event, the Chelsea Flower Show, where our membership in the Royal Horticultural Society allows us to attend on members-only day. The show gardens, each an exquisite jewel of design and execution, are created by the finest international landscape designers. Spend as much time as you choose among the inspiring exhibits, then either make your way back to the hotel or wander down the street to visit the Chelsea Physic Garden – the oldest botanical garden in London, founded in 1673. The evening is free. (B) OVERNIGHT: LONDON

LONDON *

THURSDAY MAY 23RD- This morning we visit Kew Gardens in the London suburb of Richmond. Kew Gardens runs an internship program with Smith College and we'll have a private tour, meet with the interns, and have a special lecture from members of the Kew scientific staff. After lunch at Kew (included), we continue to the Cotswold Hills, where we will visit Hidcote Manor garden, England's foremost 20th-century



garden, where a series of horticultural "rooms" have been created, each different in color, character, and intention. It is a short drive from here to our hotel, where Paula will give a short lecture before dinner. (B, L, D) **OVERNIGHT: COTSWOLDS**

FRIDAY MAY 24TH - We'll spend the morning at Rosemary Verey's personal garden at Barnsley House. We'll have a tour with the head gardener before enjoying lunch in the appropriately named, Village Pub. After lunch, we drive to Barton Heath House, where we'll enjoy a private tour with the owners, Mr & Mrs Hamish Cathie. Barton is an Inigo Jones house, not generally open to the public. From here we return to our hotel for a free evening. **(B, L) OVERNIGHT: COTSWOLDS**

SATURDAY MAY 25TH - Driving south through the Cotswold Hills our first stop is to Daglingworth House, where we will have a private tour of this magnificent garden that is not usually open to the public. We'll continue to the city of Bath, where we will have time for lunch and then visit the Roman Baths, perhaps the best-preserved Roman remains in Britain. Returning to our hotel, we'll stop in the town of Tewkesbury to visit the fabulous Norman Tewkesbury Abbey. We will then repair to the historic Gupshill Manor (now a pub) where Tim Johnson will give a short lecture before dinner in the private dining room. **(B, D) OVERNIGHT: COTSWOLDS**

SUNDAY MAY 26TH - This morning, a short drive brings us to the village of Winchcombe, where we'll visit Sudeley Castle. Catharine Parr, Henry VIII's last wife, is buried in the chapel in the gardens at Sudeley. Then we'll have a panoramic drive through the Cotswold Hills; a quintessentially English landscape of honey-colored villages and green meadows. We stop in Bourton-on-the-Water, with the River Windrush flowing peacefully through the center of the village. After time for Sunday lunch in a local pub, we drive to beautiful Kiftsgate Court gardens, home of Heather Muir, a pioneer in the rediscovery of shrub roses (including the celebrated rambling *Rosa filipes* "Kiftsgate"). Free evening. **(B) OVERNIGHT: COTSWOLDS**



MONDAY MAY 27TH - Leaving the Cotswolds, we head to the 240-acre flagship garden of the Royal Horticultural Society at Wisley. Wisley is the jewel in the crown of the RHS and has been a living encyclopedia for gardeners for the past 100 years. We'll have time for lunch and then tour the garden's highlights with one of the local gardeners and also have free time to browse the Wisley store. Upon our arrival in Windsor, after checking in to our hotel, there will be free time before gather for a farewell dinner. **(B, D) OVERNIGHT: WINDSOR**

TUESDAY MAY 28TH - Morning transfers to London Heathrow Airport for return flights to the U.S. (B) **OVERNIGHT: HOME**

Key to included meals: **B** - breakfast, **L** - lunch, **D** - dinner

make adjustments in the following circumstances:

- 1. Exchange rates. Should the value of the dollar fall against the currency of the countries visited on your tour by more than 10% in the 6 months prior to trip departure.
- 2. Group size. This tour has been based on a group size of 15-20 participants. Should we end up with less than 15 people, Discover Europe will work with the Smith College to determine a course of action which will involve either paying a surcharge to keep the tour as is, or making adjustments to the tour in order to keep the cost the same.
- 3. Airfares. If your tour includes airfare, Discover Europe reserves the right to pass along increases in costs (taxes, airport fees, fuel surcharges, etc.) that are charged by the airline involved.

REFUND POLICY

- 1. Participants who withdraw more than 90 days prior to tour departure will receive a refund of all monies received by Discover Europe, Ltd., less a \$200 cancellation penalty.
- 2. Participants who withdraw fewer than 90 days prior to tour departure will receive a refund of all monies received by Discover Europe, Ltd., less the following cancellation penalties:

90-61 days prior to departure: \$1000 per person

- 60 days trip departure: no refund (unless traveler has insurance)
- 3. Please note that the final payment becomes due upon receipt of the final invoice and will remain payable, as per the above schedule, if your cancellation is received after this.
- 4. These cancellation penalty amounts do not include any airfares purchased on your behalf by Discover Europe Ltd. Note that the least expensive airfares are usually non-refundable. Refunds for airline tickets will be handled separately from the refund of the land tour package.
