DUBLIN & BELFAST

A TALE OF TWO CITIES: FOCUSING ON BOOKS, LIBRARIES AND CULTURE

June $12^{TH} - 21^{ST} 2020$

Dear Vassar Travelers,

I invite you to join me on a tour of two remarkable cities: Dublin and Belfast, and their surrounding areas. Though physically close (they lie only a hundred miles apart) their political and cultural differences are well-known and very real, in no small part because of their histories. Dublin is the populous capital of the Republic of Ireland, long influenced by Catholicism. Belfast is the capital of Northern Ireland, and so part of the United Kingdom; here Protestants have long occupied the majority. At the same time the cities share undeniable commonalities. Our visit investigates both of these features, with stops at a variety of places inside and outside the urban areas. A special focus of the tour will be the long and noteworthy connections Dublin and Belfast have had to the world of literature, books, and libraries.

We start in Dublin; among our visits are St. Patrick's Cathedral, where Jonathan Swift was Dean, and the

adjacent Marsh's Library, noted for its eighteenth century holdings. At Trinity College Library we will examine the 1,200-year-old Book of Kells and the beautiful Long Room Library. Next we go to what some call one of the best museums in Europe: the Chester Beatty Library in Dublin Castle, which holds a stunning array of ancient bookish treasures from the Far East, the Middle East, Africa, and Europe. There will be an opportunity to see a play at the Abbey Theatre, founded in 1904 by William Butler Yeats and Lady Gregory. A highlight of our stay in Dublin will be the chance to attend events on June 16th, also known as Bloomsday, the annual city-wide celebration of James Joyce's novel *Ulysses*.

Moving north to Belfast, we will explore its literary and bibliographic traditions and visit some of its landmark sites. Our first day includes the famous *Titanic* Museum (the ship launched from Belfast), as well as a chance to visit the Linen Hall Library - the oldest such institution in Belfast - to learn about its impressive holdings on Irish and Local Studies, Robert Burns, and Early Belfast and Provincial Printed Books. The landscape of Northern Ireland has inspired many creative works, from C.S. Lewis's Chronicles of Narnia to HBO's Game of Thrones. On our second day we will head outside the city to Bellaghy to visit the Seamus Heaney HomePlace, where we will be drawn into Heaney's life through artifacts, photos, and audio recordings of the Nobel Prize winner reading his own works. We will then travel on to the amazing Giant's Causeway, a natural wonder and a UNESCO World Heritage site.

Please join me if you can for what promises to be a stimulating and reflective journey!

FRIDAY, JUNE 12TH - Departure from your chosen US gateway city. OVERNIGHT: PLANE


SATURDAY, JUNE 13TH - Your morning arrival at Dublin Airport will be met for the transfer to our city-center hotel. If our rooms are not available for immediate check-in, there will be time to find lunch and begin exploring the neighborhood. This afternoon we will have a chance to unpack and rest up from the overnight flight. This will be followed by a visit to St. Patrick's Cathedral, the national cathedral of the Church of Ireland and the burial place of Jonathan Swift (dean from 1713-45), and Marsh's Library, next door to the cathedral. This evening we will gather for a welcome reception and dinner at the hotel.

(D) OVERNIGHT: DUBLIN

Sunday, June 14TH - When it comes right down to it, all of Ireland is a garden. Still, some of the loveliest settings in Ireland revolve

around its gardens; havens of peace and tranquility. The gardens at Powerscourt House, located at the foot of the Wicklow Mountains, were created in the 1740s by Richard Wingfield, the Viscount Powerscourt. With the highest waterfall in Ireland, Powerscourt offers numerous attractions including formal gardens and landscaped walks with more than 200 varieties of trees, shrubs, and flowers. We'll continue on to Glendalough, a monastic settlement founded in the 6th century, where we'll have lunch (included). The rest of the afternoon and evening are free - perhaps sample a traditional Irish pub (or two) for dinner. **(B, L) OVERNIGHT: DUBLIN**

Monday, June 15TH - Today we will explore Dublin with a panoramic sightseeing tour. Our first stop will be to Trinity College, Ireland's oldest college, for a special presentation organized just for our group. After our presentation, we will view the celebrated Book of Kells, an illuminated text of the Gospels, dating back to 800 AD. We will make a stop for lunch before continuing to the Chester Beatty Library and Museum. Once the private



library of Sir Alfred Chester Beatty (1875 - 1968), the museum now houses an extraordinary collection of manuscripts, rare books, and other treasures from Europe, the Middle East, North Africa and Asia. There will be free time to have an early supper before we attend a performance at the Abbey Theatre (subject to their schedule). **(B) OVERNIGHT: DUBLIN**


Tuesday, June 16TH - Today is Bloomsday - the annual celebration of James Joyce's masterpiece *Ulysses*. The whole novel is set on June 16th, a day in the life of Leopold Bloom. There will be many events scheduled in the city, both today and the preceding days, but at the time of writing the schedule has not yet been published. (B) **OVERNIGHT: Dublin**

Wednesday, June 17th - We head north across the border today to Belfast, the capital of Northern Ireland. En route we'll stop first to see the Hill of Tara, location of the palaces of the Celtic High Kings and literary inspiration to a host of writers. Traveling through the Boyne Valley, we'll also stop at 5,000-year-old Newgrange, one of the most spectacular archaeological sites in Europe. We'll continue north, across the border, into the "six counties," to Belfast. On arrival in Belfast, we will check into our hotel and have time to freshen up before gathering for a short tour of the city center. Dinner is included this evening. (B, D) OVERNIGHT: BELFAST

Thursday, June 18TH - Our first visit this morning is to the *Titanic* museum. Belfast is the home to Harland & Wolff, the builders of this legendary vessel. After time for lunch, we'll head a short distance out of the city to visit nearby Mount Stewart House, now owned by the National Trust, to explore its magnificent gardens. On our return to the city, the rest of the afternoon and evening are free. Prof. Patkus will take those interested to the Linen Hall library, Belfast's oldest library, founded in 1788. (B) OVERNIGHT: BELFAST

FRIDAY, JUNE 19TH - This morning we'll drive north to the Antrim Coast. We first stop at the Seamus Heaney HomePlace Museum in the village of Bellaghy, celebrating the life and literature of the poet and Nobel Laureate who was one of Ireland's greatest writers. After lunch here (included), we will head to the Giant's Causeway, with its bizarre basalt columns that recede into the ocean, which gave rise to the legend of the giant, Finn MacCool, who is said to have laid out the steps to reach his lady love in Scotland. We return

to Belfast for a free evening. (B, L) OVERNIGHT: BELFAST



SATURDAY, JUNE 20TH - Today we say goodbye to Belfast, and head back south across the border. Upon arrival in the lovely seaside town of Malahide, you will have time to explore the town and find lunch before we gather for a tour of Malahide castle and gardens. This evening our farewell dinner will be in the nearby fishing village of Howth, accompanied by traditional Irish music. (B, D) OVERNIGHT: MALAHIDE

SUNDAY, JUNE 21ST - You may have time this morning for a little last minute shopping before your transfer back to Dublin Airport for returning flights to the U.S. (B) OVERNIGHT: HOME

In such case, our liability shall be strictly limited to refund of the recoverable cost of any unused portion of the tour. Should you decide not to participate in certain parts of the tour or use certain goods included in the tour, no refunds will be made for those unused parts of the tour or goods.

- 1. A deposit of \$500 must accompany this completed form (if it has not already been paid).
- 2. The remaining balance will be billed and payable 90 days prior to trip departure.

TOUR COST ADJUSTMENTS

Discover Europe makes every effort to guarantee that the published cost of your chosen tour will not change. However, we do reserve the right to make adjustments in the following circumstances:

1. Exchange rates. Should the value of the dollar fall against the currency of the countries visited on your tour by more than 10% in the 6 months

- prior to trip departure.
- 2. Group size. This tour has been based on a group size of 15-20 participants. Should we end up with less than 15 people, Discover Europe will work with Vassar to determine a course of action which will involve either paying a surcharge to keep the tour as is, or making adjustments to the tour in order to keep the cost the same.
- 3. Airfares. If your tour includes airfare, Discover Europe reserves the right to pass along increases in costs (taxes, airport fees, fuel surcharges, etc.) that are charged by the airline involved.
- 4. Late registrations (received within 60 days of departure) may also incur extra fees and charges as discounted rates for hotels and airfares may no longer be available so close to departure. Participants will be made aware of any such charges before their registration is accepted.

REFUND POLICY

- 1. Participants who withdraw more than 90 days prior to tour departure will receive a refund of all monies received by Discover Europe, Ltd., less a \$200 cancellation penalty per person.
- 2. Participants who withdraw fewer than 90 days prior to tour departure will receive a refund of all monies received by Discover Europe, Ltd., less the following cancellation penalties:
 - 90-61 days prior to departure: \$1000 per person
 - 60 days or less prior to departure: no refund
- 3. Please note that the final payment becomes due upon receipt of the final invoice and will remain payable, as per the above schedule, if your cancellation is received after this.
- 4. These cancellation penalty amounts do not include any airfares purchased on your behalf by Discover Europe, Ltd. Note that the least expensive airfares are usually non-refundable. Refunds for airline tickets will be handled separately from the refund of the land tour package.
