


BRITAIN IN BLOOM

A private tour of the gardens at Barnsley House is also part of our program.

Naturally, there are a host of other gorgeously blooming favorites along the way – the 20th-century beauty of Hidcote Manor, the Savill Garden in Windsor, and Kiftsgate's profusion of shrub roses, to name a few. All at a relaxed pace

TUESDAY, JULY 3RD - Evening departure from U.S. for your overnight flight to London.

WINDSOR * WEDNESDAY, JULY 4TH - Upon arrival at either of London's airports, you *SALISBURY will be met and transported to our hotel in Royal Windsor. After time to unpack and relax, the rest of the day is free to unwind and recover from the overnight flight. In the afternoon your guide will conduct an orientation meeting and lead a short optional tour to points of local interest. This evening we gather for a welcome dinner at our hotel. (D) OVERNIGHT: WINDSOR


THURSDAY, JULY 5TH - This morning we begin our horticultural adventures with a guided tour of Savill Garden. Created in 1930 by Sir Eric Savill, the Savill Garden is one

of Britain's greatest ornamental gardens. We then visit the 240-acre flagship garden of the Royal Horticultural Society at Wisley. This jewel in the crown of the RHS has been a living encyclopedia for gardeners for the past 100 years. We'll have free time for lunch on arrival and then tour the garden's highlights, with plenty of time to browse the Wisley store. The evening is free to sample a local restaurant in Windsor. (B) OVERNIGHT:

WINDSOR

FRIDAY, JULY 6TH - This morning we leave our hotel by private coach for Hampton Court Palace, Henry VIII's magnificent Tudor home. We'll have a full day to spend at the Hampton Court Flower Show and an opportunity to explore the state apartments and the kitchens, with free time for lunch. Later in the afternoon, we'll depart for Salisbury, with time to unpack and relax before we meet in the evening for dinner. (B, D) OVERNIGHT: SALISBURY

SATURDAY, JULY 7TH - Today begins with a visit to Stonehenge. This World Heritage Site has been attracting visitors for nearly 5,000 years now and remains one of the most enigmatic monuments in the world. Heading back into



Salisbury, we'll stop at Heale Gardens for a visit. Surrounding a Grade I listed Carolean manor house, a wonderfully varied collection of shrub, musk and other roses grow in a formal setting of clipped hedges and mellow stonework. A short drive returns us to Salisbury where the rest of the afternoon and evening are free. (B) OVERNIGHT: **SALISBURY**

SUNDAY, JULY 8TH - Leaving Salisbury, we wind our way to the historic city of Bath. Stopping at Bath Abbey, the last of the great English pre-Reformation churches, we cross the piazza to the Roman Baths, some of the most extensive and bestpreserved Roman remains in the country. There will be time for lunch, perhaps in the

more modern Pump Room, the scene of Bath society in Jane Austen's time. From Bath, we continue on through the Cotswolds, where picturesque villages nestle among rolling hills. It's a short ride through the picture-book countryside to our hotel, where dinner awaits us this evening. (B, D) OVERNIGHT: COTSWOLDS

MONDAY, JULY 9TH - It's a beautiful drive today through the Cotswolds' quintessentially English landscape of honeycolored villages and green meadows. In the afternoon, we'll

> visit the Hidcote Manor garden, England's foremost 20th-century garden, where a series of horticultural "rooms" have been created. each different in color. character, and intention. Next, we'll visit the beautiful Kiftsgate Court gardens, home of Heather Muir, a pioneer in the rediscovery of

shrub roses (including the celebrated rambling Rosa filipes "Kiftsgate"). The evening is free to sample a local restaurant.

HIDCOTE MANOR

Tuesday, July 10TH - This morning, we visit Barnsley House and the masterpiece garden created by Rosemary Verey, one of the most influential gardeners of the 20th century. We'll have a tour with one of the head gardeners, giving us an opportunity to see how the ideas and designs from her many books and articles are reflected everywhere in this glorious space, before we gather for lunch at the Village Pub. This afternoon we drive to nearby Tetbury, where we'll have a tour of Highgrove, the private estate of Prince Charles, the Prince of Wales (subject to confirmation). We return to our hotel with time to relax and freshen up before dinner at our hotel. (B, L, D) OVERNIGHT: COTSWOLDS

WEDNESDAY, JULY 11[™] - Leaving the Cotswolds, we'll stop in Oxford, the city of dreaming spires, for a tour of the city center. From here, we return to Windsor, where we gather for our farewell dinner at the hotel. (B, D) OVERNIGHT: WINDSOR

THURSDAY, JULY 12TH - Morning transport to either of London's airports for return flights to the U.S. (B)

Key to included meals: **B** - breakfast, **L** - lunch. **D** - dinner
