

For the duration of our visit, Gavin has chosen a wonderful, four-star country house hotel that is also recognized locally for its excellent restaurant. From our base here, we'll take a variety of day trips to the surrounding area hightlights.

We'll also enjoy time in the royal town of Windsor at both ends of the trip. While the object of our stays here is primarily practical, due to the town's proximity to the airport, we find it makes a wonderful place to begin and end a tour of Britain

without having to suffer the crowds, the traffic and expense of traveling into central London.

FRIDAY, JULY 16TH - Departure from your international gateway city to London.


OVERNIGHT: PLANE

SATURDAY, JULY 17TH - Upon arrival at either of London's airports, you will be met and transported to the hotel in Windsor. After time to unpack and relax, the rest of the day is free to unwind and recover from the overnight flight. In the afternoon your guide will conduct an orientation meeting and lead a short optional tour to points of local interest. This evening we gather for a welcome

dinner at our hotel. (D) OVERNIGHT: WINDSOR

Sunday, July 18TH - Leaving Windsor behind, we travel to the northeast, into the pristine countryside of East Anglia. Our destination is Dedham Vale, the home of John Constable, one of England's best-loved landscape painters. We will tour the sites of many of his famous paintings, including Flatford Mill – remarkably unchanged since the early 19th century. Then we head north across Suffolk and Norfolk past the cathedral city of Norwich, time permitting we may attend Evensong at the cathedral before continuing to our country house hotel on the north coast at Sheringham. We gather for dinner together this evening. (B, D) OVERNIGHT: SHERINGHAM

MONDAY, JULY 19TH - A short drive to Cromer, just along the coast, to board the Poppy Line private steam train for a ride through the gently undulating North Norfolk countryside to the charming Georgian town of Holt. There will be time to explore the town's antique shops, book stores, and art galleries and to have lunch before we return to the coast to take




a boat trip to Blakeney Point, a National Trust seal and bird sanctuary. We return to our hotel for dinner. **(B, D) OVERNIGHT: SHERINGHAM**

Tuesday, July 20th - This morning we travel to nearby Norwich for a walking tour of this magnificent medieval city: Tombland, Marketplace, Guildhall, and quaint, cobbled streets. There will be time for lunch, perhaps at the Adam & Eve, a pub for cathedral workers in the 13th century, and then the afternoon is free to visit the Castle museum, browse England's largest open air market, or wander the medieval streets with their intriguing little shops. Alternatively, for those who are interested, Gavin will arrange a boat trip on the wetlands of the Norfolk Broads. We'll head back to our hotel this afternoon for dinner. (B, D) Overnight: Sheringham

Wednesday, July 21st - A leisurely start to a day spent exploring two great treasures of the National Trust. Our first stop is Blickling Hall, built in the 17th century and one of England's great Jacobean houses. We'll tour the gardens and have time for lunch before the first guided tour of the house in the early afternoon. From here it's a short drive to Felbrigg Hall, renowned for its original 18th-century furniture and painting collection. We return to our hotel for dinner. **(B, D) OVERNIGHT: SHERINGHAM**

Thursday, July 22ND - Today there will be a leisurely excursion to Sandringham, built in 1870 for the Prince and Princess of Wales. Described as "the most comfortable of houses," it is where the Royal Family traditionally spends Christmas. We will



visit the museum, tour the state apartments, and wander the gardens before returning to our hotel for a free afternoon and we gather for dinner together in the hotel dining room. (B, D) OVERNIGHT: SHERINGHAM

FRIDAY, JULY 23RD - Leaving Norfolk, we stop in Cambridge for a walking tour of the ancient university: Trinity Great Court, King's College Chapel, and 800 years of architecture and tradition. There will be free time to explore the warren of Cambridge's ancient colleges, museums, and shops, and to have lunch. The truly intrepid may try a hand at punting on the River Cam before we gather again for the short ride back to Windsor. We'll gather for a final farewell dinner at our hotel. **(B, D) OVERNIGHT: WINDSOR**

SATURDAY, JULY 24TH - Morning transfers to the airport for returning flights to the U.S. (B)
