September $18^{\text{th}} - 28^{\text{th}} 2021$

Wessex, was originally the Kingdom of the West Saxons. At the time of the Viking invasions of around 900 CE, there were seven Anglo-Saxon kingdoms in Britain: Northumbria, Mercia, East Anglia, Essex, Kent, Sussex and Wessex, stretching from the Scottish border, across the Somerset levels, and into south-west Cornwall.

The ridges of chalk hills across the south of the country created routes for trade and travel that had been in use from neolithic times. For this programme, we will use these ancient tracks, particularly the Harrow and South Downs Ways, to explore some of our most beautiful landscape, homes and castles. From the chalk downlands of Sussex to the Jurassic coastline of Dorset, we traverse sections of these ancient pathways across Britain.

It is said that we are all related in some way to King Alfred or William the Conqueror and no doubt in our travels we will find many familial names and ancestors of note!

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 18TH - Departure from your chosen US gateway city. **OVERNIGHT: PLANE**

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 19TH - Upon arrival at London Heathrow Airport, you will be met and transported to our hotel in Sussex (a drive of approx. 1hr 40 mins). Our accommodation will be at the historic and delightful Horsted Place Hotel. Loved by all who stay there, this is a true country house hotel with a very special Royal connection, and very close to the battlefields of 1066. A chance to unpack before we make a gentle afternoon visit to the oldest medieval moated priory in existence at Michelham. More than 800 years old, this is a truly magical place, and we will also take the opportunity to visit the Castle and gardens of Herstmonceaux. Within 300 acres of woodland and parkland, this is one of the oldest brick buildings remaining in England and illustrates the influences of the early Kings very well. We will return to the hotel for dinner together. (D) OVERNIGHT: LITTLE HORSTED







Monday, September 20TH - The Battle of Hastings in 1066 allowed William the Conqueror access to British soil and once he arrived the Kingdom of Wessex officially ceased to exist. There are very rare examples of architecture and buildings dating prior to the 11th Century, but in many areas of historic interest there are anglo-saxon origins and foundations built on over the centuries. This morning we will visit the historic town of Battle, and guests will have time to explore the historic Abbey and location for the Battle of Hastings, in this small medieval town. We will have lunch at the Hub at Quarry Farm, before paying a visit to the stunning and atmospheric Bodiam castle. Bodiam was built in 1385 by a knight serving under King Edward III and is a beautiful example of a medieval moated fortification. We return to the hotel where dinner is under your own arrangements this evening. (B, L) OVERNIGHT: LITTLE HORSTED

Tuesday, September 21st - Our first stop this morning is a visit to the home of the Dukes of Norfolk (the Howard family) at Arundel Castle. Originally built in 1067 for the 1st Earl of Arundel, this was one of the first castles to be established under the rule of William. The modern, Victorian, castle is the seat of the Dukes of Norfolk, the most senior Roman Catholic member of the Court and a permanent Earl Marshal to the Monarch. There are over 20 sumptuous rooms with art by Canaletto, Van Dyck, Gainsborough and the gold rosary which Mary Queen of Scots carried to her execution. From here, we'll make our way to the historic city of Chichester to pay a visit to the delightful cathedral founded in 1075. You'll have some free time here to explore, before we head back to our hotel. We'll have supper at the Ram Inn in Firle along the way. (B, D) Overnight: Little Horsted

Wednesday, September 22nd - This morning a visit to the beautiful house and grounds of Parham House, for a private guided tour. Parham is owned and lived in by Emma Barnard and her family (Viscount Cowdray and the Pearsons – owners of the Financial Times!) and is an outstanding example of a living working estate dating back hundreds of years. Not only is the house particularly beautiful but the landscaped gardens are breathtaking, and we will be guided around the house, followed by a light lunch and a chance to wander the gardens at leisure. This afternoon, we will visit the glorious privately owned Firle Place, which has been in the same family for almost a thousand years and who are related to the Knights Templars of Warwickshire, with significant connections to William the Conqueror and the areas we visited on our previous tour in 2019. The collections and grounds are simply stunning. This evening, we'll enjoy a private tour and tasting at the award winning Bolney Vineyard Estate followed by supper, before we return to the hotel for a final night. (B, L, D) OVERNIGHT: LITTLE HORSTED



Thursday, September 23RD - Leaving this morning after breakfast, we will head to the city of Winchester for a visit to Winchester Cathedral. With roots in the 7th century, the present cathedral was started in the 11th century by William the Conqueror on the site of the "Old Minster." This was the most important Royal church in Saxon England and was the burial place for some of the earliest English kings, including Alfred the Great, King Cnut and William the Conqueror's son William Rufus. From here, we cross into Thomas Hardy's Wessex which, although fictional, was based on the Saxon geographic region, Our accommodation just beyond the New Forest and across the southern part of Dorset, will be at the award winning and family owned Priory Hotel in Wareham, where the inlets of water from Poole Harbour and estuary come to the edge of the gardens, and this is a very picturesque spot. Wareham was an important settlement dating



from 600AD, this has been the site of Saxon and Norman forts, and was a vital port, now sandwiched between Poole and Weymouth. The earliest remaining architecture dates to the 15th Century, but the atmosphere surrounding the settlement conveys the historic importance of this geographic location and its proximity to Corfe Castle. We will dine together in the hotel restaurant this evening. (B, D) OVERNIGHT: WAREHAM

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 24TH - This morning a glimpse perhaps of the famous ancient Cerne Giant carved out of the chalk hillside of the downs. From here, we will spend a little time in the ancient town of Dorchester and explore. Famous not only for the 1834 Tolpuddle Martyrs rebellion against agricultural wages, Dorchester was the fictional location for The Mayor of Casterbridge. From here we will visit Abbotsbury Swannery, the only swan sanctuary in England and on the site of the 11th Century monastery on the edge of Chesil Beach and the Jurassic coast. Lunch at The Parlour, Burton Bradstock. This afternoon, a visit to the iconic and much photographed Lulworth Castle where we will be able to take a tour and have tea perhaps afterwards for those who wish. (B, L) OVERNIGHT: WAREHAM


SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 25TH - No visit to this part of England and the Jurassic coast is complete without a visit to the amazing cliffs of Durdle Door. Here we can take in the view perhaps with a cup of coffee at the beach café, before we have lunch at the Weld Arms. A good estate Inn, we will then head to the Castle built by William the Conqueror at Corfe. This has been an important stronghold for hundreds of years and was a noted Royal Palace. Private guided tour, and an opportunity to take one of the tearoom's famous afternoon cream teas! Afterwards, we'll 'drive by' King Harry's Rocks and Swanage, and the beautiful beach of Studland Bay before we head home for dinner. (B, L, D) OVERNIGHT: WAREHAM

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 26TH - Thomas Hardy used a fictionalized 'Wessex' as the setting for many of his novels, and much of his work is featured here. We will visit Thomas Hardy's cottage, his birthplace, and his later home at Max Gate, both of which are looked after now by the National Trust. This afternoon, we will visit Sherborne Castle which was built in 1594 by Sir Walter Raleigh The ancient Abbey and town buildings are a great delight - Sherborne Abbey was a Saxon Cathedral before becoming a Benedictine Abbey and is right in the heart of this famous town with winding streets and alleys to explore. We will have a guided tour and talk here before we attend Evensong at 6.30 p.m. We will dine together in the hotel for our final night here. (B, D) OVERNIGHT: WAREHAM

Monday, September 27TH - Departing Dorset, we will make our way up to the area of North Wessex and Berkshire via the stone circle of Avebury, erected some 3,000 years before the Saxons arrived on our shores. Our final night accommodation is at the riverside private club of Phyllis Court, on the banks of the Royal River Thames at Henley. Tonight we will have a very special private tour and farewell dinner at Stonor, an important Roman Catholic stronghold and home of a former Lord Chamberlain to Her Majesty The Queen, Lord Camoys. The family have lived here for over 850 years and there are many items of rare furniture and works of art here. A 14th-century chapel sits with buildings dating to the 12th century and there are some lovely gardens giving outstanding views of the Park and valley below. Alexandra worked with Lord Camoys for some years and we are sure to spend a delightful evening here before we say goodbye. (B, D) OVERNIGHT: HENLEY

TUESDAY, 28TH SEPTEMBER - Morning transfers to London Heathrow Airport for your return flights back to the U.S. (B)

REFUND POLICY


- 1. Participants who withdraw more than 90 days prior to tour departure will receive a refund of all monies received by Discover Europe, Ltd., less a \$1000 cancellation penalty per person*.
- 2. Participants who withdraw fewer than 90 days prior to tour departure will receive a refund of all monies received by Discover Europe, Ltd., less the following cancellation penalties:
 - 90-61 days prior to departure: \$2000 per person*
 - 60 days trip departure: no refund (unless traveler has insurance)*
