Its neighbors to the north and west (Emilia-Romagna, Tuscany, and Umbria) enjoy a booming tourist industry, while Marche sits in rural tranquility, happily devoid of the convoys of tourist coaches clogging up the countryside. Marche has managed to retain its agricultural and rural nature through to this new millennium—no mean feat in this modern age. And therein lies the beauty and charm of the region.



A highlight of the tour for many will be the visits to three gorgeous renaissance villas, complete with their spectacular gardens.




much-prized wines, so we will of course take an opportunity to visit a wine Cantina for a wine tasting. We'll continue to our hotel in Fabriano, near the mountains and famous for its paper making industry, much beloved by artists. Dinner at the hotel. (B, D) OVERNIGHT: FABRIANO

TUESDAY, OCTOBER 10TH - This morning we head up into the mountains, where the Frasassi Caves are hidden in a deep gorge. Discovered in 1979 by a speleological and geological research team, they consist of a series of vast caverns with magnificent stalactites and stalagmites forming the largest complex of caves anywhere in Europe, all beautifully lit to create an enchanting atmosphere. We'll have lunch at a local restaurant very close to the Caves where there's a chance to try delicious local wild boar, as well as truffles and porcini mushrooms. In the afternoon we drive back to Fabriano, to the Paper Museum to find out about original paper making traditions in the working museum as well as the invention of the watermark. You can purchase souvenirs or pieces of hand produced Fabriano paper in the museum shop before we return to our hotel. The evening is free to sample a nearby local restaurant. (B, L) OVERNIGHT: FABRIANO

WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 11TH - After breakfast, we drive south to Ascoli Piceno, famed for its delicious stuffed olives, among other things. En route, we stop to visit the Chiaravalle Abbey of Fiastra, one of the best-preserved Cistercian abbeys in Italy, famed also for its labyrinthine wine cellars and its marvelous "vin cotto," similar to a rich port. Free time for lunch and a chance to buy products made by the monks from the little shop. If time permits we will drop into the famous Cantina Terre di Serrapadrona which makes a unique wine from an ancient vine found only in this area. This evening we arrive at our hotel in Ascoli Piceno. Dinner is included. (B, D) OVERNIGHT: ASCOLI PICENO

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 12TH - We start our walking tour by visiting Piazza del Popolo, considered to be the most elegant square in the Marche. Here we see the 13th-century Palazzo del Popolo, the church of Saint Francis, and the famous Art Deco café, Meletti where you can try café corretto, coffee with aniseed liqueur. Next we visit the cathedral in Piazza Aringa with its famous Carlo Crivelli triptych. The afternoon is free. This evening will be devoted to a cooking class - and then consuming the product of our labours! (B, D) OVERNIGHT: ASCOLI PICENO



SATURDAY, OCTOBER 14TH - Morning transfer back to Ancona Airport for returning flights to the U.S. (B) OVERNIGHT: HOME


THURSDAY, OCTOBER 5TH - Departure from your chosen US gateway. (Lufthansa - or United Airlines - via Munich, to Ancona, Italy is the preferred routing). **OVERNIGHT: PLANE**

FRIDAY, OCTOBER 6TH - Upon your arrival, you will be met for a transfer to our hotel in the center of the Roman town of Fano, just 30 minutes from Ancona Airport. After checking in, this afternoon we will have a chance to unpack, rest up from the journey, and begin exploring your new surroundings. This evening we will gather for a reception and dinner at the hotel. (D) OVERNIGHT: FANO

SATURDAY, OCTOBER 7TH - A short drive along the Adriatic Coast this morning brings us to the spectacular Renaissance gardens of the Villa Imperiale, with its famous hanging gardens, just outside the city. The villa itself is a private residence but it may be possible to see some of the fabulous frescoed rooms of the interior. We'll have free time for lunch in the centre of Pesaro, birthplace of the musician, Rossini, before returning to Fano. Fano was the end point of the ancient Roman Road, the Via Flaminia and was the largest Roman settlement on the Adriatic and was founded by Julius Caesar himself. A walking tour of the attractive center will show us the Arch of the Emperor Augustus, the church of San Francesco and the Malatesta Palace, after which you can explore around the beautiful main square, the Piazza XX Settembre at your leisure. There will also be time to shop and have a relaxing early evening aperitivo whilst watching the busy Italian street life. This evening we take a short stroll to a local restaurant for dinner to try the superb sea food. (B, D) OVERNIGHT: FANO

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 8TH- Today we set off towards the mountain village of Acqualagna, famous for both its white and black truffles to take part in a national Truffle Festival. We meet up with our Truffle hunter who will take us off to the woods to discover that elusive and mysterious fungus. We'll visit a family run factory and have an opportunity to sample the different products! After a delicious truffle lunch, we continue on to the incredible city of Urbino: a Renaissance town, a World Heritage site since 1998, and the birthplace of one of the world's most famous painters and architects, Raphael. We'll visit the Palazzo Ducale, the former residence of Duke Federico da Montefeltro, which houses the National Gallery of the Marche. The gallery was established in 1912 and was considered one of the most precious art collections in Italy at the time. Among

the important artworks on show here are the Madonna di Senigallia by Piero della Francesca and La Muta, by Raphael. If there is time we will visit the house where Raphael was born. We return to Fano for a free evening. (B, L) OVERNIGHT: FANO
